
But what is Christmas really all about?

St Mary's Friends (SMF) GALA 2019

Our major event every year is our annual **GALA**, which will be held in **Term 1** next year, on **Saturday**, **9th March 2019**. This fundraising event will be raising money for teacher resourcing and maintenance of school owned buildings (Scout Den & Little Theatre).

Throughout Term 1 we have allocated weeks when we ask families for donations such as: **Bottles** - shampoo, sauce, dishwash, fizz, chutneys, bubbles, anything that comes in a bottle.

<u>Mystery bag prizes</u> - small toiletries, small toys, bubbles, notebooks, pens, erasers, hair ties/clips, the \$2 type shops are great for these items.(look out for after Xmas specials).

<u>Grocery/Treat Week</u> - this week we are asking for either grocery items or treat items (blocks or boxes chocolate, hand wash, big bottles juice, chocolate biscuits, hand creams, etc) Again after Xmas specials.

Baking Week - On the Friday before the Gala we are ask families to provide **home baking** - cakes, slices, muffins, fudge, loaf, truffles, biscuits. If you are not able to bake we will ask for donations of baking items such as: flour, sugar, eggs, chocolate chips, etc.

<u>Plants and Produce</u> - We sell potted plants, fruit and vegetables, as well as a sauces, jams, and chutney.

We also run a <u>Silent auction</u> - Where we ask families and our business community to donate items to be used on our silent auction. We also have a liquor licence so are able to take donations to be auctioned in our designated R18 room. If you know any businesses that could support our Gala or have any items to donate please let us know.

We will be calling for people to volunteer their time to assist with the Gala event. This includes during the week of the Gala (for baking with students, collecting items, chocolate wheel prizes), on Gala day (help at a stall, set up and pack up) and on Monday (return items, clear up and tidy away).

It's a fabulous community day and lots of fun so please consider helping support our school's major fundraising event.
